

Journal Site License Agreement

This License sets forth the terms and conditions under which M.E. Sharpe, Inc. (hereafter, "MES") provides institutional subscribers (hereafter, "Institution") with access to the electronic edition of the "Journal(s)" (defined below) as follows, under the following terms and conditions:

1. Definitions

The following terms shall be deemed to have the meaning as stated below:

Institution—The customer named in the registration process, which has authorized the acceptance of this License and the completion of the online registration process, provides access, via its secure network, for its Authorized Users as defined below, and is responsible for payments and implementation of the License.

Journal(s)—The electronic (online) editions of journals licensed hereunder including tables of content, abstracts, full text and illustrations and any additional electronic journal content not included in the print versions of the Journal(s).

Site—A single, geographically contiguous office building or complex or campus location plus dial-in access by Authorized Users to the Institution's secure network, identified by the Institution's relevant Internet Protocol (IP) addresses. The Institution may not extend access through the Institution's network, to partners, joint ventures, and affiliates. MES may refuse to grant a Basic Access License to an institution claiming a range of IP addresses that, in MES's opinion, represents more than one campus or office complex.

Authorized Users—Those persons who are authorized by the Institution to have access from within the Institution's relevant IP addresses. Authorized Users must be bona fide faculty members, students, researchers, staff members, librarians, library patrons, executives, or employees of the Institution.

2. Licensed Electronic Journals and Access Privileges

MES grants to the Institution and its Authorized Users the non-exclusive, non-transferable right and license to access the full text of the Journal(s) on the terms and conditions described herein during the paid subscription period. Authorized Users will have unlimited access to Tables of Contents, abstracts, and full text of articles of the Journal(s) the Institution subscribes to. The number of the Institution's Authorized Users who may access the Journal(s) is unlimited.

Should the Institution decide to cancel its subscription to the Journal(s), the Institution will retain access to the volumes of the Journal(s) for which the Institution paid, according to the terms and conditions described herein.

The Institution acknowledges that the Journal(s) are protected by copyright. All rights not specifically granted to the Institution are expressly reserved. The contents of the Journal(s) are intended for the personal, noncommercial use of the Authorized Users.

3. Terms and Conditions of Use

The rights and restrictions governing access to the Journal(s) by the Institution and its Authorized Users are outlined in the Terms and Conditions of Use below.

- a. Authorized Users may download, view, copy and save to hard disk or diskette and store or print out single copies of individual articles or items for Authorized Users' own personal use, scholarly, educational or scientific research or internal business use. Authorized Users may transmit to a third-party colleague in hard copy or electronically, a single article or item for personal use or scholarly, educational, or scientific research or professional use or for corporate information purposes but in no case for resale.
- b. The Institution but not Authorized Users may print out and send single paper copies of articles from the Journal(s) for interlibrary loan.

Except as provided above, Authorized Users may not copy, distribute, transmit, or otherwise reproduce material from the Journal(s); store such material in any form or medium in a retrieval system (including Electronic Reserve); download and/or store an entire issue of a Journal or its equivalent; or transmit such material, directly or indirectly, for use in any paid service such as document delivery or listserve, or for use by any information brokerage or for systematic distribution, whether or not for commercial or nonprofit use or for a fee or free of charge. Material from the Journal(s) may be posted on Electronic Reserve only after permission has been obtained from MES's Rights and Permissions department.

In order to protect the integrity and attribution of the Journal(s), the Institution and its Authorized Users may not remove, obscure or modify any copyright or proprietary notices, author attribution or disclaimer contained therein or on any screen display. Authorized Users may not integrate material from the Journal(s) with other material or otherwise create derivative works in any medium. This is not meant to prohibit quotations for purposes of comment, criticism or similar scholarly purposes.

If an Authorized User fails to abide by these Terms and Conditions of Use or other terms of this Agreement, MES reserves the right in its sole discretion to suspend or terminate such Authorized User's access to the Journal(s) immediately without notice, in addition to any other available remedies. Notwithstanding the above, except in the case of a material breach, MES shall give written notice to the Institution of its intention to terminate such User's access and shall allow the Institution and/or the User 30 days after receipt of such notice to cure the breach or agree to abide by the rules or other terms or conditions of this License.

4. Mutual Obligations

MES does not warrant that the Journal will be accessible in any particular hardware/software format. MES does not warrant the accuracy or completeness of any information contained in the Journal, or its merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose. MES will have no liability to any person for any loss or damage arising out of use of, or inability to use, the Journal, including but not limited to if access is suspended or interrupted, or if the network is unavailable due to normal administration and system downtime.

The Institution will:

- a. take all reasonable measures to inform Authorized Users of the Terms and Conditions of Use governing access to the Journal(s) and emphasize to such Authorized Users the need to comply with whatever restrictions on access, use, reproduction and transmission are included therein;
- b. make access available to Authorized Users only through the Institution's secure network and from valid IP addresses at the Site; undertake reasonable measures within its control to prevent access to and

improper use of the Journal(s) by unauthorized persons; and take responsibility for terminating any unauthorized access of which it has actual notice or knowledge;

c. provide MES with information about the Institution's IP addresses, as updated from time to time, which can be used by MES to authenticate Authorized Users;

d. promptly notify MES of any copyright infringement or unauthorized usage of the Journal(s) which comes to the Institution's attention; and cooperate with MES in the investigation of such infringement or unauthorized use and in any action which MES takes to enforce its copyright, at MES expense.

5. Termination

MES shall have the right to request the Institution to terminate access to the Journal(s) by an Authorized User who breaches the Terms and Conditions of Use or infringes copyright in the Journal(s).

Notwithstanding the above, the Institution shall not be responsible for such unauthorized use which is without the express or implied consent of the Institution, provided that the Institution has taken reasonable steps to prevent such misuse and, upon learning of it, notifies MES promptly of any such breach or infringement.

MES may terminate this License if the Institution materially breaches its obligations under this License and fails to cure such material breach, provided that MES shall give written notice of its intention to terminate and shall allow the Institution 30 days after receipt of such notice to remedy the breach. No refund will be provided upon such termination. In addition, MES may terminate this Agreement at the end of any subscription period.

It is understood and agreed that MES may find it necessary periodically to change the specific terms of this Agreement. Any such change will be effective immediately upon sending a hard or electronic copy of the notification to the Institution and will not be retroactive.

6. Place of Execution

Legal interpretation of this agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York, United States of America.
